

THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE
SHERWOOD IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT
September 11, 2006

The regular meeting of the Sherwood Improvement District was held on Monday, September 11, 2006, at 3400 S.W. Urish Road, Topeka, Kansas. Board members present were W.J. White, H.J. Bromich and Bernie St. Louis. Also present were Harold Ramsey, Len Richter, Dick May, Jr. and Cathy Mosimann.

W.J. White called the meeting to order and moved for approval of the minutes of the August 2006 meeting. The motion was seconded and carried.

Bernie St. Louis moved for approval of the treasurer's report for the month of August 2006 and the following September bills for payment. The motion was seconded and carried.

Harold Ramsey, Ramsey Custom Homes LLC, attended the meeting to ask permission to have Schmidt Engineers do a study, at his expense, to determine if it is feasible to extend the drainage pipe that runs under 33rd Street 130-140 feet further. The board indicated it has no issues with his doing that. He was asked to keep in contact with Dick May.

Len Richter, Shawnee County Sheriff's Reserve Division discussed traffic concerns with the board.

Bernie St. Louis moved to have Roy Meyer repair the damage to the storm sewer pipe that was done by the subcontractor for AT&T, as per Dick's letter to AT&T. The motion was seconded and carried.

Dick reported that the intersection of Marian Lane and Ancaster has 3 cracks, which have been reported for a couple of years now. Friar has another crack 25-30 feet long. They will need to be milled down 3 inches and then refilled to level. The cost for the four cracks is \$1250. W.J. White moved to do the work with the money to cover the cost to come from the Kaw Valley Bank account. The motion was seconded and carried.

W.J. White reported that Joe Amon has done some labor on district signs. He also reported that the Supreme Court would render a decision regarding the Dillon's annexation on October 29, 2006. Finally, W.J. White moved to increase the contractual payment to Cathy Mosimann to \$400 per month. The motion was seconded and unanimously carried.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
